Speaking of student speakers and awards, one perk of being a member of CMC³ is that you can nominate your students for exclusive CMC³ scholarships! Our foundation awards an average of \$6,000 in student scholarships every year, and the student chosen as the winner of the student speaker contest also receives a \$500 scholarship.
