# CMC<sup>3</sup> Student Presentation Contest Guidelines

## Presentations in the contest will be graded on the following four main categories:

- 1) Virtual Presentation or Poster has student's and faculty mentor's name clearly indicated.
- 2) Mathematical and/or historical content
- 3) Student presentation of the material.
- 4) Presentation/Poster Design

## The following will be considered when grading on Mathematical Content:

- Mathematical and/or historical accuracy
- Topic covers material beyond the usual Community College curriculum

#### The following will be considered when grading on the Student Poster/Presentation:

- · Knowledge of subject matter
- Presentation is no longer than 5 minutes
- General Presentation Skills. (Is the presentation understandable? Is it loud and clear enough to be heard? etc.)

#### The following will be considered when grading on the Poster/Presentation Design:

- The material is well organized and the information is presented in a concise, readable way.
- The design of the poster or presentation is visually appealing

## **Group Size Limits**

Students can work in groups no larger than two on a single entry.

Awards will be split between team members.

## Mentor Responsibilities

- Make sure your CMC<sup>3</sup> membership is current.
- Help student in selecting an appropriate topic
- Help student create a plan that fits within the allotted time, ensuring all deadlines are met
- Support student in investigating the topic
- Allow the student to do their own work, but provide guidance when needed
- For in-person submissions, review poster before display in Monterey.
- For virtual submissions, review student presentation prior to submission
